In view of the fact that the significance of a commitment of lifelong learning and life time education is being discussed only in recent years even in educationally advanced countries, the possibility of the idea becoming an integral part of educational thinking seems to be a far cry. For, to move in that direction means much more than simple rearrangement of the present organization of education. But a good beginning can be made by Open University programmes for older learners of different categories and introducing extension services in the conventional colleges and schools. 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should learn to cooperate with the numerous community organizations such as libraries, museums, municipal recreational programmes, health services etc.
